From the Chairmen of the Foreign Correspondents' Club Hong Kong Charity Ball Committee

From humble beginnings a decade ago, the Foreign Correspondents' Club Charity Ball has grown to have real impact on the needlest children in Hong Kong while becoming one of the territory's largest and most sought-after charity events.

Starting with a scholarship program that supports students leaving the PLK system for tertiary education, the program has expanded tremendously. The driving insight in the beginning was that kids entering university lack the financial and mentoring support of an extended family to pursue university degrees.

Now known as the PLK/Henrik Nielson/FCC Scholarship Fund, the program has supported more than 100 scholarship winners in the last decade. Thanks to the funds raised this year, we will be able to award more than 52 years of scholarship to 15 awardees.

They included aspiring doctors, lawyers, economists and bankers planning to study at Hong Kong University, Hong Kong Polytechnic, Chinese University of Hong Kong and Hong Kong Baptist University. Our first scholarship winner is now a full solicitor with the high court, another is a qualified doctor; there are nurses, engineers, teachers and bankers.

Now, with more than a decade of scholarship winners, the graduates themselves have formed their own alumni association, mentoring their peers and actively raising funds supporting the scholarship fund and charity that gave them their start.

The Charity Fund next focused on developing a language training program to provide English and Mandarin language instruction to children still in residential care at the various Po Leung Kuk centres and group homes. The driving concern was that a lack of language ability would hamper the ability of Po Leung Kuk graduates to enter Hong Kong's competitive workforce. As a result of the PLK/UBS/FCC Language Training Program, many residential students have shown marked gains in self-confidence and have excelled in language skills beyond students in mainstream schools.

With Hong Kong's most impoverished families suffering more than most during the financial crisis, the Charity Fund launched a brand new community-based centre with the primary goal of providing language instruction to the children in the Lei Muk Shue area of the New Territories.







One of Hong Kong's most financially disadvantaged areas, there are many at-risk youth from a range of different ethnic backgrounds. Now, the Po Leung Kuk/ Merrill Lynch/FCC Children¹s Learning Centre has become an integral part of the community.

Within the centre is the UBS Child Development Program to help children from low income families with educational and social welfare programs.

This year, we are proud to announce the imminent opening of a third language centre, the Po Leung Kuk/Sprouts Foundation/FCC Educational Services Centre. Located near Tai Wai, the centre will provide free English and Mandarin classes to needy children from the area.

We are now also planning our fourth centre in another impoverished area in the New Territories.

These initiatives would not be possible without the deep dedication of the many people who generously donate their time and money to help organize our events and oversee and run these programs. We would like to take this opportunity to once again thank our partners, volunteers and staff for their generous and unwavering support.

That said, the Charity Fund and our initiatives are all about the children. Please take a moment to read inside about our amazing scholarship winners and the children of the Po Leung Kuk. When you do, you will quickly understand the scale of our achievements during this the tenth year of the Charity Fund.

To address the social and emotional needs of these children who mostly come from deprived family backgrounds, the PLK/UBS/FCC Children's Development Programme complements the language courses with various learning programmes and social work support, aiming to promote the overall development of the children as well as harmonious family relationships. The PLK/UBS/FCC Baby College is a further development which provides courses and developmental opportunities for pregnant mothers, and their partners and families, as well as parents with children from 0 - 3 years of age to facilitate a best start in life through improved relationships and education.

The newly established PLK/Sprouts Foundation/FCC Education Services Centre caters to the needs of the underprivileged families and children in Shatin. With more funding support from warm-hearted donors, similar projects can further be set up providing extra-curricular learning opportunities to more disadvantaged children in the territory.

We are most thankful to all committee members of the FCC Charity Fund who have contributed so much of their time and efforts in making these projects a distinct success. Our heartfelt appreciation also goes to all donors and partners who have made significant contributions to enrich the charity fund. We shall count on the continued support of our well-wishers, and together we can bring a better tomorrow for the underprivileged.

PLK / UBS / FCC Language Training Programme



The LTP has now completed six years of extracurricular English, Putonghua and storytelling classes to children and young people aged from 3 to 18 years living in residential care in Po Leung Kuk. The children, the staff and myself thank you once more for your generosity which allows this to happen.

During the term we have classes in the evening for the children and young people which are fun and interesting and involve a lot of games, role play and other activities to motivate their learning. During the holidays we participate in fun activities and outings which help the students to develop better language skills and confidence in an informal environment. Our highlights this year were outings to Macau with 15 secondary students in August, our annual Easter camp with 20 primary students to Wan Tsai Island and our outing to Disneyland with all 46 kindergarten students in the summer. Your contributions and support help to make this possible.

We also remember and explore the students' own cultural celebrations and celebrations celebrated by other cultures throughout the year. We have continued with our annual Drama show in January and the Biliteral and Trilingual Singing Competition in July. Audiences for these events are most welcome! Come and let the kids show you what they can do!

PLK / Merrill Lynch / FCC Children's Learning Centre



We have now completed our second year at the Children's Learning Centre in Kwai Chung. Thanks to you and your contributionswithout which we wouldn't be able to do this meaningful work.

We work with children and young people aged from 3 – 18 from disadvantaged families in the Tsuen Wan, Tsing Yi and Kwai Chung districts of Hong Kong and aim to improve their language skills and confidence in communicating with others. We provide English, Putonghua and Storytelling classes and children come to the centre twice a week. Classes are fun and enjoyable and students and parents report great improvement in ability and confidence. The centre is very popular and at the start of the new academic year we still had 75 students on the waiting list!

Ben is one of our P 4 students who has ADHD and his mother has said that his English has improved a lot since attending the CLC classes and also the programme has helped to focus his attention and improve his confidence.

During each year we are able to provide experiences for the children and young people that they would never have achieved otherwise- from autumn barbecues to going to the theatre.

Your kindness and generosity have allowed us to work with these needy children and young people to improve their language skills, motivation and confidence. Who knows what they can achieve in the future- all thanks to you and your generosity!

PLK / UBS / FCC Children's Development Programme



The Children's Development Programme has had a fantastic second year and we have expanded to offer Baby College to the children and families living in the Tsuen Wan, Tsing Yi and Kwai Chung districts of Hong Kong. All thanks to your generosity and support.

The Children's Development Programme works to support the holistic development of the children and young people attending the Children's Learning Centre and runs courses to help them develop better concentration skills, deeper empathic awareness of others and socialize more ably with others. Hailey's mum commented that her daughter has more confidence and is more willing to contribute her ideas after attending the centre.

Our newest development, Baby College, runs courses for pregnant women and their partners and families to provide information in nutrition, safety and building a relationship with their new arrival. We offer a full developmental workout for babies aged 0 – 3 with their families. Providing a positive learning environment for our next generation and allowing them every opportunity to learn and develop will improve their skills and knowledge for the future. Promoting a daily reading habit supports the development of vocabulary which will help these children have better understanding in school.

Without your generosity we couldn't manage any of this - thanks once again for your support.

The PLK, Sprouts Foundation and FCC Education Services Centre



The newest programme is the Po Leung Kuk, Sprouts Foundation and FCC Education Services Centre in Tai Wai. The centre started classes in December and will provide English and Storytelling classes to 120 students at primary level. Students who attend these classes come from disadvantaged families where, among the adult population in Tai Wai, approximately 22% have been educated no further than primary school, with some having only pre-primary education. A further 15.5% have completed lower secondary level. Almost 25% have a monthly household income of less than HK\$10,000 per month. Approximately 8% of the households are single parent families and approximately 6% of the population lives on Comprehensive Social Security Allowance. If the parents have received little formal education themselves, they face great difficulty in helping their own children to develop further and break out of the cycle of poverty.

Thanks to you for your generosity and sponsorship which allows us to provide classes to improve the children's language skills, to increase their confidence and to give them a chance to have a better future.

Candice is a former scholarship winner. Here is her touching story



Hi, my name is Candice, one of the FCC scholarship winners. I'd like to thank everyone for giving me a chance to tell you about my experiences with Po Leung Kuk and FCC.

I grew up in PLK, the local orphanage, because of my father's physical abuse and my mother's suicide when I was a baby. My father didn't give up our guardianship but refused to provide for our living expenses, so we didn't have enough money to buy any clothes, personal items or even a pair of glasses. I have 2 sisters, one of them is my twin sister, Suki. People say we look similar, so if you see a girl who looks just like me but doesn't say hi or respond to you, then that's probably Suki, and not me.

In PLK, they gave us clothes and it was there that I met a very nice social worker. She tried very hard to help me to find a pair of glasses from the sponsor. Since I grew up quickly, she even gave me some of her clothes. Because of PLK, I know many nice people and I'm really grateful for all the things that I have received from them. It was a place that I could call home, where I not only found protection but also love and care.

The reason I know about the FCC is because after I turned 18 I had to leave PLK, but unlike the other orphans, I didn't have public housing from the government and had to apply through the normal process which took 5 years. So I did not have a place to live. At the same time, I was accepted to the Chinese University of HK for the 3 year higher diploma in business studies. I was heavily in need of financial assistance to pay for school fees and living expenses. Luckily, through PLK, I knew a group of people who came to my aid. They found me a place to live, and fortunately, I received a scholarship from the FCC. I also found a part-time job as a teaching assistant at a PLK language teaching centre which the FCC also helps to sponsor and where I learnt my English. Therefore, I was able to afford my living expenses and pursue my academic studies.

The FCC scholarship truly opened windows for me. It provided me with a chance to have a wonderful and meaningful school life at CU, where I could join different student activities and focus on my accounting and finance studies. It lessened the pressure for me to work extra hours to fund for my education.

It is also through the FCC that I got a great opportunity to join the Macquarie group mentorship program, to meet very kind professionals who were willing to share with and advise me about the real business world. As an accounting major, the mentorship program is truly priceless to me as I am gaining confidence and learning valuable insights. Since I grew up in the orphanage, I suffered from low self-esteem and I used to think that I would only work minimal jobs like my family members. I would never have imagined that one day I'd be able to meet kind and successful people like Celia, Dave and the mentors from FCC and Macquarie bank. It is really life changing for me that I can have a dream and make it come true!

I hope I can graduate soon and be a successful accountant in the future. So that one day I can serve the community with my knowledge and help others and give back what you have given to me. Thank you, from the bottom of my heart.



Independent Assurance Report and Statement of Income and Expenditure for the Fund Raising Activities held on October 8th 2011

Independent Assurance Report

In accordance with our agreed terms of engagement, we have performed an engagement on the attached income and expenditure account of the fund-raising activities of the Foreign Correspondents' Club, Hong Kong (the "Club") with Po Leung Kuk held on 8 October 2011 (the "Event").

Respective responsibilities of the Club and ourselves

The Club are responsible for preparing the attached income and expenditure account in accordance with the basis of preparation set out in pages 3, setting out the gross subscriptions raised from the Event and the expenses incurred in connection with the Event. This responsibility includes designing, implementing and maintaining internal controls relevant to the preparation and presentation of the income and expenditure account so that it reflects the subscriptions raised and expenses incurred in connection with the Event and is free from material misstatement.

It is our responsibility to form a conclusion on the attached income and expenditure account, based on our engagement, and to report our conclusion to you.

Basis of conclusion

We conducted our engagement in accordance with Hong Kong Standard on Assurance Engagements 3000 "Assurance Engagements Other Than Audits or Reviews of Historical Financial Information" issued by the Hong Kong Institute of Certified Public Accountants ("HKICPA").

The work undertaken in connection with this engagement is less in scope than an audit conducted in accordance with Hong Kong Standards on Auditing and consequently does not enable us to obtain assurance that we would become aware of all significant matters that might be identified in an audit. Accordingly, we do not express an audit opinion.

Furthermore, due to the nature of cash receipts and expenses relating to general charitable fundraising activities, it was not practicable for us to determine whether the income and expenditure account and the books and records of the Club include all transactions relating to the Event. It was impracticable for us to quantify the potential impact of this on the income and expenditure account. Accordingly, our report relates solely to the income and expenditure account prepared from transactions that have been recorded in the Club's books and records.

Our engagement included carrying out limited procedures for obtaining sufficient appropriate evidence to be able to draw a conclusion, such as inquiries primarily of persons responsible for financial and accounting matters, analytical procedures applied to financial data and other review procedures we considered necessary.







Conclusion

Based on the foregoing, we report that nothing has come to our attention that causes us to believe that the attached income and expenditure account does not reflect, in all material respects, the gross subscriptions raised and the expenses incurred by the Club in respect of the Event that have been recorded in its books and records made available to us in accordance with the basis of preparation set out in pages 3.


