Mark your calendars---Tears for Fears will perform at this year's ball on October 10th.









PLK / UBS / FCC Language Training Programme



As we start our eleventh year of providing extra curricular English, Putonghua and story telling classes to the 300 children and young people aged from 3 to 18 years living in residential care in Po Leung Kuk, I'd like to thank you for your support, kindness and generosity on behalf of the children, the staff team and myself.

Our classes are fun and interesting and involve a lot of games, role play and other activities to motivate the students' learning. During the holidays we participate in fun activities and outings which help the students to develop better language skills and confidence in an informal environment. Our highlights this year were our annual Easter camp with 20 primary students to Cheung Sha camp on Lantau Island, the outing to Macau with 15 secondary students in August, and our outing to Pizza Express with all 50 kindergarten students also in August. Your contributions and support help to make this possible.

We also remember and explore the students' own cultural celebrations and celebrations celebrated by other cultures throughout the year. We continue to have our annual Drama show which will be held in January 2015 and the Biliteral and Trilingual Singing Competition in July. Audiences for these events are most welcome! Come and let the kids show you what they can do!

We have been providing extra-curricular language classes for almost 6 years in the Children's Learning Centre in Kwai Chung. We are thankful to you and for your contributions without which we wouldn't be able to do this meaningful work.

We work to improve the language skills of more than 250 children and young people aged from 3 – 18 from disadvantaged families in the Tsuen Wan and Kwai Tsing districts. We provide English, Putonghua and Storytelling classes which are fun and enjoyable. The centre is very popular and at the start of the new academic year we still had 180 students on the waiting list! We started to offer classes in the local Social Welfare Department offices and we have 20 children learning there.

lona, the primary Storyteller, said "We can see that the children's confidence and social skills are improving each year. They speak English boldly. It's the games and competitions that they need to participate in that develops this." Also, during each year we are able to provide experiences for the children and young people that they would never have achieved otherwise. Our annual Christmas Carnival was bigger and better this year with extra exciting game booths, more food stalls and better prizes. Feedback from the local residents was excellent.

PLK / UBS / FCC Children's Development Programme



The Children's Development Programme has had another fabulous year and has now been running for 6 years! Baby College has grown from strength to strength in the 5 years it has been running. Through these programmes we can offer support to the children and families living in the Tsuen Wan, Tsing Yi and Kwai Chung districts of Hong Kong.

The Children's Development Programme works to support the social and emotional development of the children and young people attending the Children's Learning Centre and runs courses to halp them develop better consentration.

to help them develop better concentration skills, deeper empathic awareness of others and socialize better with others.

Baby College runs courses for pregnant women and their partners and families to provide information on nutrition, safety and building a relationship with their new arrival.

We offer a full developmental workout for babies aged 0 – 3 with their families.

We believe that providing a positive learning environment for our next generation and allowing them every opportunity to learn and develop will improve their skills and knowledge for the future. Promoting a daily reading habit supports the development of vocabulary which will help these children have better understanding in school.

Thank you very much for your generosity, as without it we couldn't provide this level of help and support to the people who really need it the most in Hong Kong.

The PLK, Sprouts Foundation and FCC Education Services Centre



The Po Leung Kuk, Sprouts Foundation and FCC Education Services Centre in Tai Wai is halfway through its third year and is very popular. The centre provides English, Putonghua and Storytelling classes to 144 students at primary level.

Students who attend these classes come from disadvantaged families where, among the adult population in Tai Wai, approximately 22% have been educated no further than primary school, with some having only pre-primary education. A further 15.5% have completed lower secondary level. Almost 25% have a monthly household income of less than HK\$10,000 per month. Approximately 8% of the households are single parent families and approximately 6% of the population lives on Comprehensive Social Security Allowance.

If the parents have received little formal education themselves, they face great difficulty in helping their own children to develop further and break out of the cycle of poverty.

Thank you for your generosity and support which enables us to provide fun, activity based classes to improve the children's language skills, to increase their confidence and to give them a chance to have a better future.





The PLK, Sprouts Foundation and FCC Secondary Education Services Centre



The Po Leung Kuk, Sprouts Foundation and FCC Secondary Education Services Centre in Tai Wai has started its second year and is very popular. The centre provides English and Interactive Reading classes to 96 students from Secondary 1 to Secondary 4. We also offer Elective courses to secondary students to further develop their skills in areas of interest. They can develop skills in English, for example reading skills or writing better essay skills; skills in Business, for example in making presentations or writing resumes; and skills in Putonghua. These real life skills will help these students as they leave school and move to start their careers.

This centre has been set up to complement the PLK, Sprouts Foundation and FCC Education Services Centre by building on the skills and knowledge that has been developed there. The students who attend these classes come from disadvantaged families in Tai Wai and this secondary centre provides the support to help them gain better qualifications and move out of the cycle of poverty.

FCC Charity Fund / Macquarie Bank sponsored "Tackling Life" rugby programme



Year 3 of the FCC Charity Fund/Macquarie Bank sponsored "Tackling Life" rugby programme kicked off with a Fun Day at Shek Kip Mei Park on 28th June 2014 attended by over 200 students, teachers, parents and volunteers. Due to it's success another one was held on 18th October at King's Park which this time attracted close to 400 boys and girls from 13 primary schools and 3 education centres!

Each participant received a souvenir rugby ball – as a physical representation of the student's life, and has written on it a pledge to lead a positive and healthy lifestyle, hopefully helping to teach them important life skills and core values. Shirts and gifts from the FCCHK Charity Fund Committee were also distributed.

This season 7 new primary schools joined the programme, adding to the existing 8 schools and the summer programmes organized with the Children's Learning Centre and the two Education Services Centre that are also designed to encourage confidence in communication in the English Language.

One of the highlights of Year 3 was the opening ceremony of the Po Leung Kuk Holiday Camp pitch at Tai Tong in March. With this wonderful new facility we hope we can attract even more Po Leung Kuk schools to sign-up for Tackling Life in the future!

There are currently 16 participating "Tackling Life" Schools in the FCC Charity Fund/Macquarie Bank sponsored rugby programme. Plus the Causeway Bay Learning Centre and Tai Wai and Kwai Chung Education Services Centres.

Independent Assurance Report

In accordance with our agreed terms of engagement, we have performed an engagement on the attached income and expenditure account of the fund-raising activities of the Foreign Correspondents' Club, Hong Kong (the "Club") with Po Leung Kuk held on 1 November 2014 (the "Event").

Respective responsibilities of the Club and ourselves

The Club are responsible for preparing the attached income and expenditure account in accordance with the basis of preparation set out in page 3, setting out the gross income raised from the Event and the expenses incurred in connection with the Event. This responsibility includes designing, implementing and maintaining internal controls relevant to the preparation and presentation of the income and expenditure account so that it reflects the income raised and expenses incurred in connection with the Event and is free from material misstatement.

It is our responsibility to form a conclusion on the attached income and expenditure account, based on our engagement, and to report our conclusion solely to you as a body. We do not assume responsibility towards or accept liability to any other person for the contents of this report.

Basis of conclusion

We conducted our engagement in accordance with Hong Kong Standard on Assurance We conducted our engagement in accordance with Hong Kong Standard on Assurance Engagements 3000 "Assurance Engagements Other Than Audits or Reviews of Historical Financial Information" issued by the Hong Kong Institute of Certified Public Accountants ("HKICPA").

The work undertaken in connection with this engagement is less in scope than an audit conducted in accordance with Hong Kong Standards on Auditing and consequently does not enable us to obtain assurance that we would become aware of all significant matters that might be identified in an audit. Accordingly, we do not express an audit opinion.

Furthermore, due to the nature of cash receipts and expenses relating to general charitable fundraising activities, it was not practicable for us to determine whether the income and expenditure account and the books and records of the Club include all transactions relating to the Event. It was impracticable for us to quantify the potential impact of this on the income and expenditure account. Accordingly, our report relates solely to the income and expenditure account prepared from transactions that have been recorded in the Club's books and records.





Our engagement included carrying out limited procedures for obtaining sufficient appropriate evidence to be able to draw a conclusion, such as inquiries primarily of persons responsible for financial and accounting matters, analytical procedures applied to financial data and other review procedures we considered necessary.

Based on the foregoing, we report that nothing has come to our attention that causes us to Based on the foregoing, we report that nothing has come to our attention that causes us to believe that the attached income and expenditure account does not reflect, in all material respects, the gross income raised and the expenses incurred by the Club in respect of the Event that have been recorded in its books and records made available to us in accordance with the basis of preparation set out in pages 3 to 4.

Any donations received in respect of the fund-raising activities after the date of approval of the statement of income and expenditure will be accounted for as donations for the fund raising activities of the following year.

Following discussions with the Finance Department of the Po Leung Kuk, the list of donations of amount HK\$9,236,961 made directly to the Po Leung Kuk as per the donor list provided by the FCC and agreed with Po Leung Kuk, were made solely on account of the fund raising efforts carried out by the FCC Charity Ball Committee.


